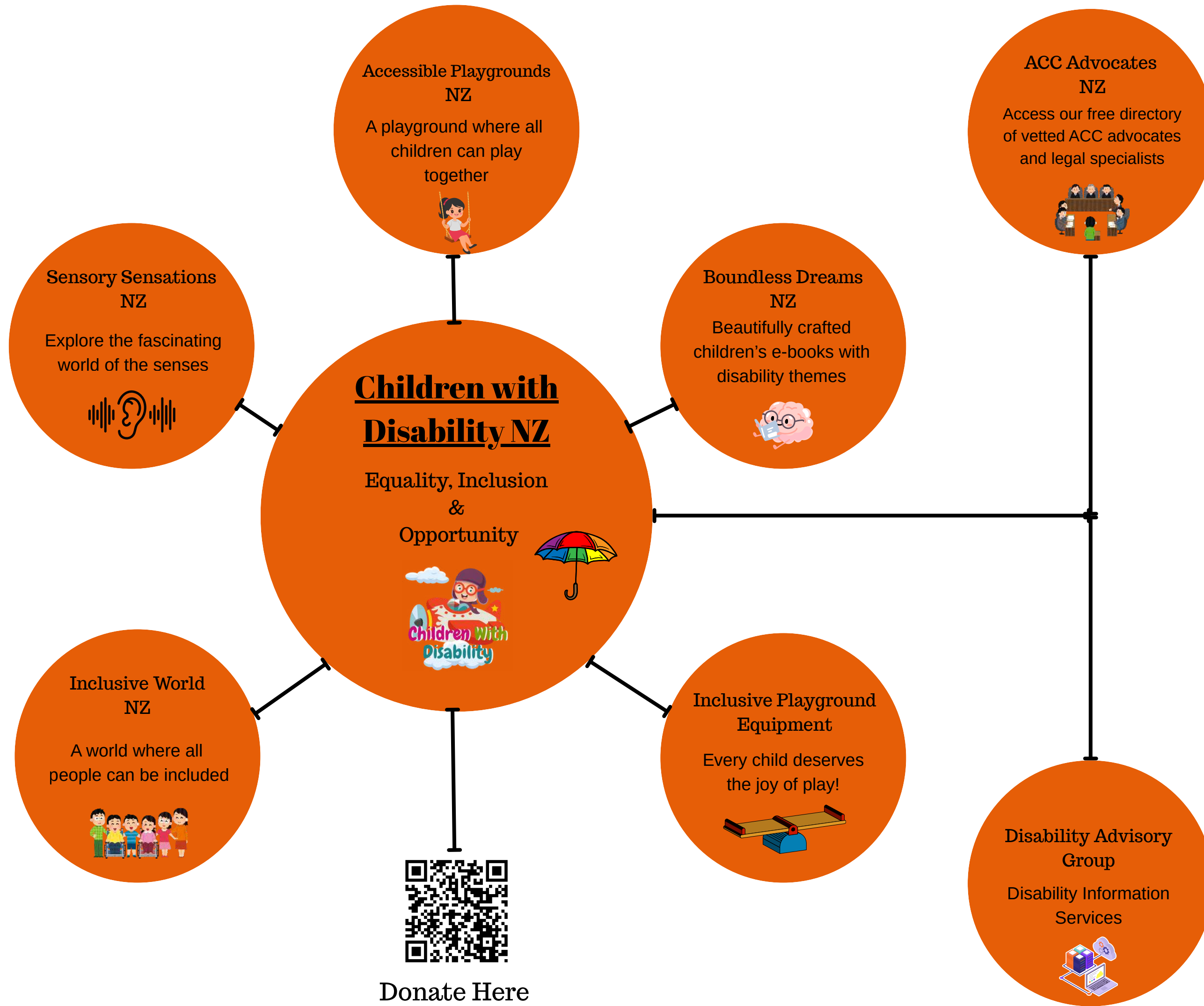

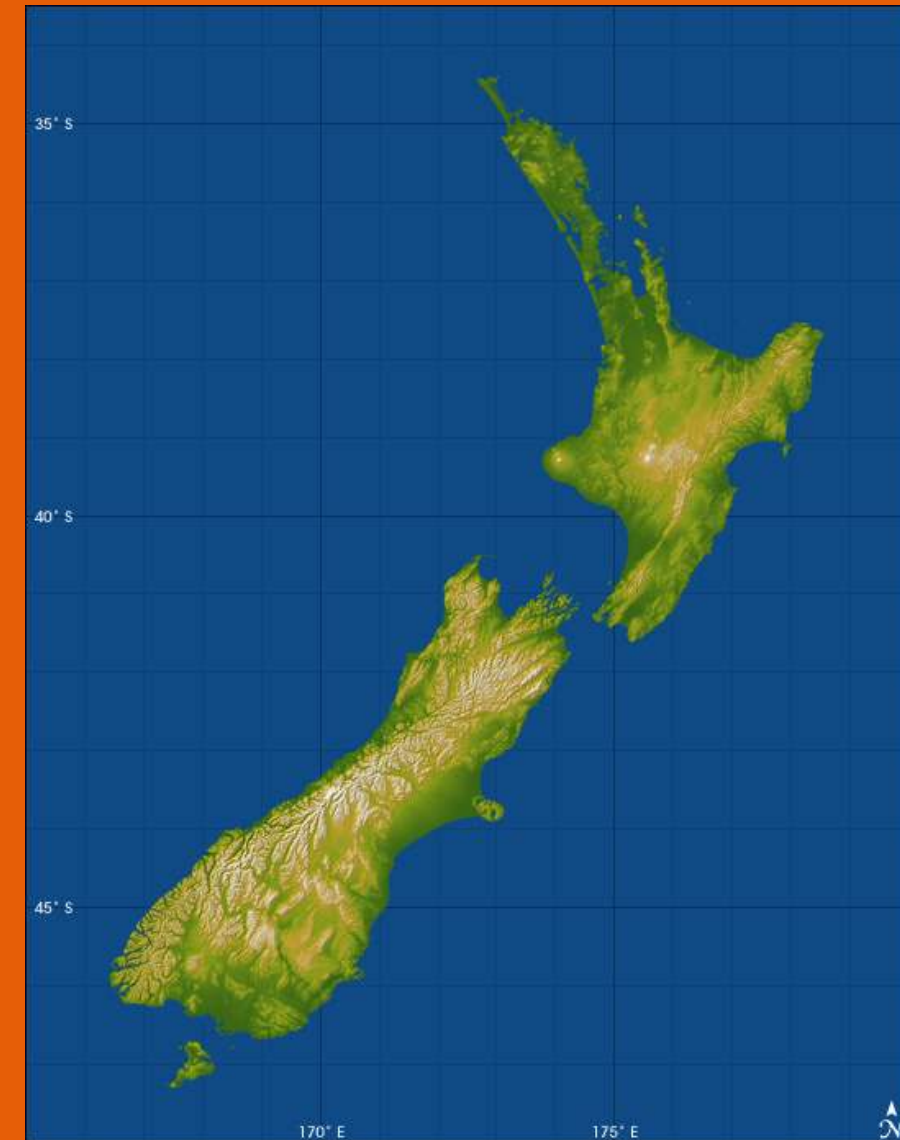


What Do We Do?

- Accessible Playgrounds NZ helps families discover inclusive, wheelchair-friendly playgrounds across New Zealand. We provide a curated map and guide so every child can play safely and joyfully, regardless of ability.

How Do We Do It?

- Accessible Playgrounds NZ provides a nationwide map of inclusive playgrounds, highlighting features like ramps, adaptive swings, sensory play zones, accessible toilets, and calm spaces—while inviting families to share suggestions and experiences to expand the list.



ACCESSIBLE PLAYGROUNDS NZ

What Do We Do?

- We promote the design and creation process of playgrounds where children of all abilities can play, learn, and grow together. Our focus is on creating safe, engaging, and inclusive spaces that welcome everyone—whether they use a wheelchair, have sensory sensitivities, or need extra support.

How Do We Do It?

- We promote the creation of fully accessible, sensory-rich, and socially inclusive playgrounds. Thoughtful design features—like ramps, wide pathways, interactive panels, and soft surfaces—ensure safety, comfort, and fun for all children. Through community projects, such as transforming Pohe Island, we set new standards for inclusive play across New Zealand.



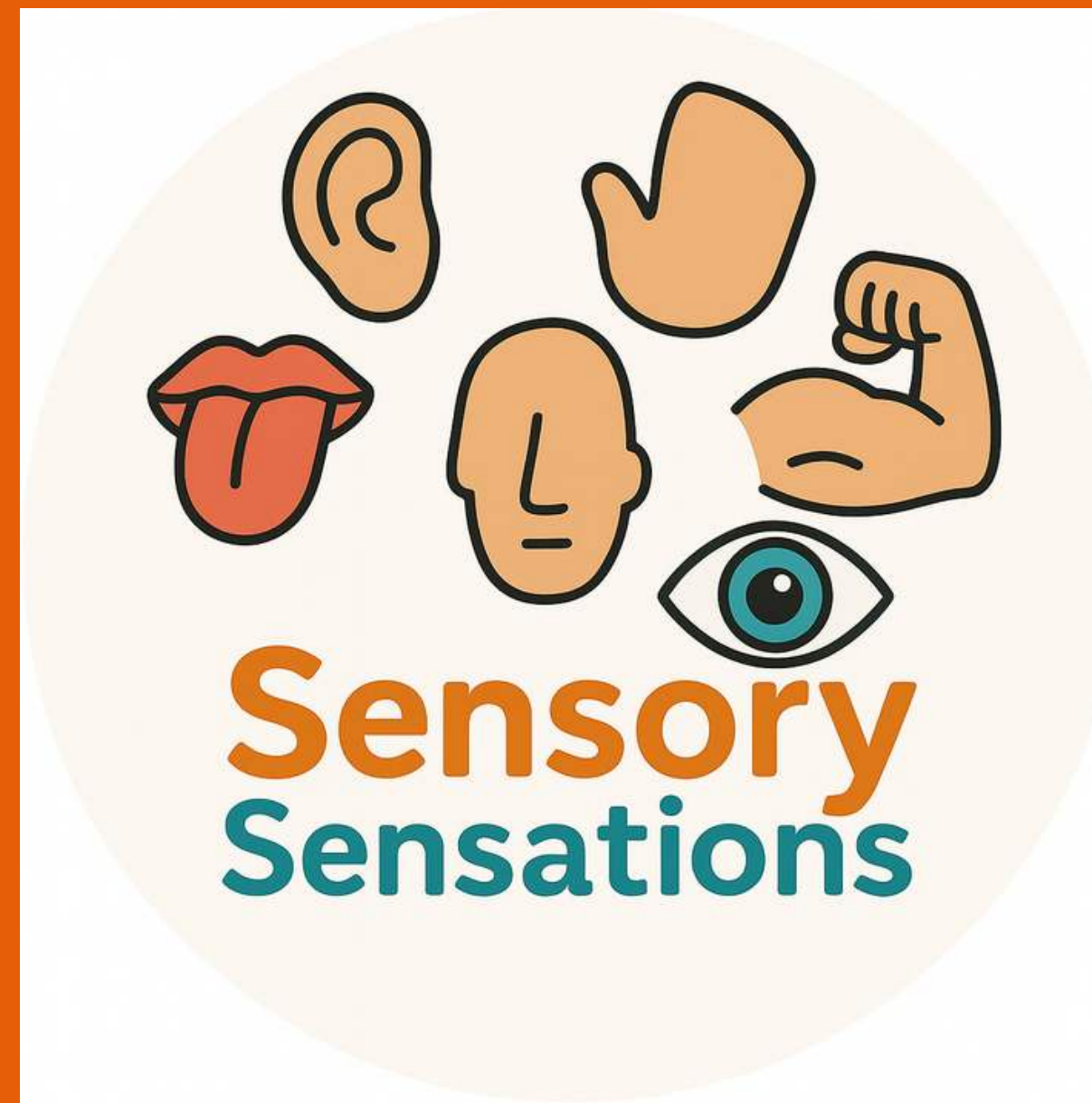
INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT

What Do We Do?

- Sensory Sensations NZ helps children and families explore the world of the senses and understand sensory processing differences. Through engaging resources, stories, and research, we build empathy, awareness, and practical support for children—especially those with sensory sensitivities or autism.

How Do We Do It?

- Created with support from the Whangārei District Council, Sensory Sensations NZ helps children and families understand how our senses work and what sensory overload feels like. Through free eBooks, stories, and NZ-focused resources, we make learning about the senses fun and relatable—building empathy, awareness, and inclusion for children of all abilities.



SENSORY SENSATIONS

What Do We Do?

- Boundless Dreams NZ creates inclusive and empowering children's stories that celebrate diversity and give disabled children authentic representation. Through beautifully crafted e-books, audiobooks, and wall art, we aim to spark imagination and foster a world where every child belongs.

How Do We Do It?

- We create free, disability-themed flip books and audiobooks featuring disabled heroes, alongside free resources that support educators and families in teaching inclusion.

- Inclusive World NZ works to create a society where people with disabilities don't just live—they thrive. We empower individuals to connect, grow, and lead meaningful, independent lives through inclusive community initiatives.
